 - They are appreciated for their versatility and charm and this example has excellent form, colour and patina.
 - Suitable as a dining table in a small space, or an accent piece or desk. Injects texture and historical depth to period, modern and contemporary interiors, blending well with a wide range of design styles.
 - This characterful tavern table is a fine example of vernacular furniture
 - The trestle form is the most practical and comfortable for seating.
 - This table seats eight to ten
 - It has a finely figured, single plank, thick, oak top. Supported by shaped-trestle ends joined by a central, pegged stretcher standing on trestle feet. In original condition. Excellent original colour and patina.
